Our Day At The Peanut Garden Playschool*

| 8:30-9:00 | Morning arrivals | A teacher will meet families arriving at the door, sign children in and collect their lunches, backpacks and outerwear. <br> After sign in, children will be helped with putting their belongings away and washing their hands before joining the group either inside or outside. (When weather necessitates sunscreen, please apply prior to arrival. We will reapply as needed throughout the day) |
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| 8:30-9:15 | Morning activities/Morning snack | During this time, children may choose to engage in all available activities. A morning snack of fresh fruit and cereal will be available during this time. Depending on the season/weather, this time may be spent inside the classroom or outside. |
| 9:30 | Clean up |  |
| 9:40-10:10 | Circle time | During circle time, we gather together as a whole class. We use this time to have important conversations, read stories, sing songs, share our experiences with one another and make intensions. We are also practicing crucial skills like taking turns when we speak, active listening, self management and self-regulation. |
| 10:10-10:20 | Bathroom break | As we transition out of circle time, we take a quick bathroom/diaper check break and wash hands again. If we are moving into small groups, children are directed to either go outside or remain inside after washing hands. |
| 10:30-11:20 | Small group work | We utilize small groups in a variety of ways: <br> $\sim$ Part or all of our pre-k group may meet at this time to work on projects. <br> $\sim$ We may create age-blended groups to allow our older children to teach out their skills and mentor their younger peers. <br> $\sim$ We may use this time to take part of our class on a neighborhood walk. <br> ~If we notice some of our children are engaged in a particular story or game together, we may use this time to give them the opportunity to continue to let their play unfold. <br> $\sim$ We may also use this time to create more time together or some space apart between friends if we see the need. |
| 11:25-12:15 | Rotate groups |  |
| 12:20:-12:30 | Wash/Bathroom Break | Both groups clean up, use the bathroom and wash up for lunch. |
| 12:30-1:15 | Lunchtime | Children are sent to wash up for lunch in staggered groups, generally with our youngest/napping children earliest and our oldest/non-napping children being seated later. Rest mats are set out during lunch. |
| 1:00-1:30 | Rest time transition | Following lunch, children are sent to use the toilet or have their diaper changed and wash their hands before going to their rest mats. |


| 1:30-3:00 | Rest time | Children who fall asleep will be allowed to sleep until they wake natu- <br> rally unless otherwise requested by their family. |
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| All children are required by law to have a rest/quiet time on an individ- |  |  |
| ual mat or cot of a minimum of 20-45 minutes. During this time, chil- |  |  |
| dren who do not sleep may do quiet activities on their mats, such as |  |  |
